The 2 New Pitches

An explanation on why we need these new pitches.

Amphill & District Community Rugby Club has grown into one of the largest clubs in the region and as a result of this success; we have struggled to find enough pitches to play on.

Local schools have been very accommodating but the problem with using these other facilities means that teams are dispersed and often there are not suitable changing and toilet facilities... so having 2 extra pitches close to the Club just makes good sense.



This map explains where the new pitches are being created. You can see the existing 2 older pitches at the top of the picture, so the new ones in the field indicated with the red flag are close to our Club facilities and car parks.

Having everyone together on busy playing days just makes so much sense and it also means that we can hold more tournaments.

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New Pitches questions continued...

How long will it take to get the new pitches completed?

We hope that they will be ready for early 2012 as long as we get a good grass growing summer.

Will there be a car-park on the new pitches?

No – we will continue to use the club car park, and the Amphill Park car parks.

Will you be putting buildings on the new pitches?

No – apart from re-seeding back to grass, the only permanent structures will be 4 rugby posts.

Is the Fence around the new pitches permanent?

Yes – we need to protect the surrounding heath land and areas of special interest.

Why don't you put more than 2 new pitches on the new site?

We could have put up to 4 pitches but were restrained by the additional cost and were concerned with additional environmental considerations.

Are you going to sell the old ground for housing development?

No – it will always be a rugby club with pitches.

We want our club to provide rugby playing facilities for the children of the area long into the future.



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
